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





It is now over 20 years since we first welcomed opera lovers to Opera at Jimbour.

Teddy Tahu Rhodes has performed with the opera companies of San Francisco, Austin, Washington, Philadelphia, Dallas, Cincinnati, Houston, the Metropolitan Opera, Hamburg Staatsoper, Bayerische Staatsoper-Munich, Theatre du Châtelet-Paris, Welsh National Opera and Scottish Opera. His Awards include an ARIA, two Helpmann Awards, a Limelight Award, a Green Room Award plus an MO Award. Solo discography includes ABC Mozart Arias, The Voice, Vagabond, The Bach Arias, and Mozart Requiem.



Mong has received a Helpmann Award Nomination for Best Female in a Supporting Role and was a Green Room Award Winner for Best Female in a Supporting Role-both in 2014 for her commanding appearance as Madame Mao in Nixon in China for Victorian Opera.

Other major roles have included Gilda (Rigoletto) for Opera Australia; Pamina (The Magic Flute), Gretel (Hansel & Gretel) and Amina (La sonnambula) for Pacific Opera.



Australian tenor <u>lain Henderson</u> is a widely sought after performer with a strong ringing sound and an energetic performance style.

Currently a Principal Artist with Opera

Australia, lain made his Company début as Don Jose in Carmen for OA's National Tour; he made his mainstage début as Pang in Turandot. In 2023, lan Henderson sang Spalanzani in The Tales of Hoffmann for Opera Australia and covered Mime in their new production of Der Ring des Nibelungen. In 2024, he sings Normanno (Lucia di Lammermoor) and Cavaradossi (Tosca) for Opera Queensland and appears in Il trittico and Hamlet for Opera Australia.

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ENSEMBLE Q

With a core artist list of some of the finest musicians in Australia, Ensemble Q is directed by Co-Artistic Directors cellist Trish Dean and clarinetist Paul Dean. Born in 2017 out of a desire to create an ensemble with virtuosic integrity and a dedication to performance of undiscovered masterpieces, Ensemble Q has earned an enviable reputation for brilliant programming and the highest performance standard.

Ensemble Q is proudly a Company in Residence at the Queensland Performing Arts Centre (QPAC) and from its inception has been Ensemble in Residence at the Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University.

Ensemble Q have been selected as both national and regional touring artists for Musica Viva and have appeared at festivals including the Australian Festival of Chamber Music, George Town Festival (Penang), Brisbane Festival, Bellingen Muse and the Queensland Music Festival. The ensemble has performed regionally in NSW and QLD and at the Ukaria Cultural Centre in SA, and in its own boutique concert series in Sydney. They are regular artists for ABC Classic and 4MBS Classic FM, QPAC Digital and the Australian Digital Concert Hall.

Comprising string quintet, wind quintet, piano and percussion, Ensemble Q's repertoire possibilities are endless and range from the most exquisite solos through to full chamber symphonies. Ensemble Q programs are based on belief in the impact and quality of every work presented, from unknown gems from the past through new works by young Australian composers, to the greatest masterpieces, all presented in convincing and passionate performance at a world class level. The audience experience is paramount in their thoughts and often visual and experiential elements are encased in their performances.

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GRIFFITH UNIVERSITY QUEENSLAND CONSERVATORIUM

The Queensland Conservatorium Symphony Orchestra usually consists of approximately 90 of the most talented young instrumentalists in Queensland.

The orchestra, from its home at the Griffith University South Bank campus, performs an annual series of orchestral concerts, large choral works, and operatic and musical theatre productions, in addition to a range of creative collaborations both on site as well as in the wider community.

Resident conductors Johannes Fritzsch, Peter Luff and Peter Morris are joined each year by distinguished guest conductors from around the world, providing students with the rich depth of experience they will find when entering the profession.

Notable guest conductors have included Sir Neville Marriner, Peter Sculthorpe, Jessica Cottis, Nicholas Braithwaite, Natalia Raspopova, Larry Rachleff and Elim Chan, to name a few.

For Opera at Jimbour the orchestra consists of a handpicked selection of the finest students at QCGU, performing in a side-by-side capacity with members of Ensemble Q, directed by Concertmaster Adam Chalabi.



The Chinchilla Big Band, originally founded in 2014, is renowned for delivering great music across the Western Downs and can often be spotted out performing across our region at big festivals and events.




DOES JIMBOUR HOUSE HAVE A LIFT?
